**Mohs Case #** \_\_\_\_\_ (correspond with case log)

- Histologically aggressive tumor
- Large tumor (entire cosmetic unit, scalp > 5 cm diameter)
- Difficult anatomic site (external auditory canal, perianal, intranasal, nailbed, medial canthus)
- Complex histopathologic interpretation (cases other than BCC and SCC)
- Tumors involving bone
- Tumors requiring more than four stages
- Multiply recurrent tumor or tumor recurrent after radiation therapy
- Surgeries requiring the expertise/involvement of surgical colleague in another discipline
- Patient with extremely complex medical problems requiring special intraoperative management.

**Reconstruction Case #** \_\_\_\_\_ (correspond with case log)

- Random pattern flap repair
  - Advancement
  - Rotation
  - Transposition
  - Pedicle
- Grafts
  - Split thickness
  - Full thickness
  - Cartilage
  - Composite (Chonrocutaneous)
- Repairs at difficult anatomic sites; e.g., eyelids, lips, intraoral
- Repair of defects greater than 10 sq cm

**Note:** Fifty (50) complex Mohs cases and fifty (50) complex reconstructions are required for all Director and Associate Director Applicants. This checklist should be submitted with each complex Mohs case and each complex reconstruction, noting why the case is complex. This form should accompany the operative report, operative notes, photographs (if available) and map (Mohs cases) for each case illustrated. Cases can overlap, i.e., a complex Mohs case with a complex reconstruction can be included to count towards both the fifty complex Mohs cases and fifty complex reconstructions. The case numbers on this form should correspond with the Applicant's annual case log submitted with the application.
