

Mohs Surgeons Leading the Future: American College of Mohs Surgery

Mentor Information and Application

Summary

• The American College of Mohs Surgery Foundation invites applications for mentors in the one-year leadership program: *Mohs Surgeons Leading the Future*. The duration of the program is from the 2023 to the 2024 Annual Meetings. The program will accept up to eight participants and eight mentors this year. Participants will learn valuable leadership skills, gain exposure to the leadership and strategic goals of ACMS, and have a seasoned Mohs surgeon leader as a mentor. This program requires a time commitment for monthly meetings as well as travel to three in-person programs. Most costs to participate will be provided by the ACMS Foundation.

Purpose

- The purpose of the leadership program is to support and grow the influence of Mohs surgeons and the ACMS in their commitment to patients with skin cancers by developing and strengthening a pipeline for leadership within the ACMS.
- Program participants have the opportunity to improve their leadership skills and develop in their careers while helping to advance the strategic goals of the ACMS (e.g. working in the ACMS infrastructure and/or policy world).

Program Structure

The program will involve three components: project-based learning (comprising the bulk of the program), mentoring, and leadership training.

MENTORING

- Each participant will be partnered with a mentor from a group of ACMS volunteers. This pairing will provide formal leadership development support involving goals and a written understanding between mentor and mentee. Mentoring pairs will meet monthly by phone or video conference, and face-to-face meetings three times a year.
- Both the mentor and the mentee give and grow in the mentoring process. You, the mentor, have the opportunity to review your accomplishments and challenges, as a reminder of lessons learned. In sharing your expertise, you are leaving a legacy and guiding another's career path. This also gives you an opportunity to review and reenergize your personal career goals.
- Participants will be able to select a mentor from the group of mentors identified by the Foundation Committee. Mentor-mentee pairs will have an opportunity to meet by phone or virtually to see if the match is a good fit prior to the first meeting of the program.

Eligibility/Participation Requirements

- Any ACMS member may apply to be a mentor.
- Completed applications must be received by January 1, 2023.
- This Program involves a significant time commitment over the course of a year. Mentors and applicants will be required to sign a contract agreeing to participate in all activities including:
 - o One (1) day meeting associated with the 2023 ACMS Annual Meeting May 4-7 in Seattle, WA.
 - One (1) day meeting associated with the 2023 ASDS Annual Meeting November 2-5 in Chicago, IL.
 (Travel and hotel costs are included for those not planning on attending this meeting.)
 - o One (1) day meeting associated with 2024 ACMS Annual Meeting May 2-5, Phoenix, AZ
 - Monthly Mentor-Mentee calls
 - o Occasional calls/Zoom meetings with participants and committee
